A Presentation by NYC Parks Department on a Proposed Master Plan for the Waterfront Esplanade and Park at Bushwick Inlet in Brooklyn Community Board No. 1

The Parks Department retained the services of Brooklyn-based landscape architect Donna Walcavage to develop a conceptual master plan for the 1.6 mile public esplanade that will be developed as a result of last year's Greenpoint and Williamsburg rezoning initiative. The plan will provide a conceptual framework for developers along the waterfront so that they can better understand the City's overall vision for the esplanade as well as for the future 23-acre park at Bushwick Inlet. With input obtained earlier this year from Community Board 1 and local stakeholders, the Parks Department has created a compelling vision for the waterfront that will set forth conceptual site plan recommendations, design standards and program goals that will assure the future of the esplanade as a public park and community asset. The Master Plan will compliment the Waterfront Access Plan that was approved last year along with the rezoning initiative.
